MODULE 6: COMPOSITION

1. **Module 6 Assignment 1 (M6A1): Composition Research**

Recommended Time Investment: 1-2 hours **Recommended Frequency:** Weekly, as needed

Recognising and observing composition and compositional techniques needs to become a part of how you intuitively observe art and design, understanding the hidden layer of image creation.

1. Gather 5-10 reference images, comprising of inspirational artwork, classical art, drawings and even photos
2. Draw over the images digitally or traditionally, making notes on compositional tools used
3. Do your best to try and identify how many compositional techniques are implemented in each work

2. **Module 6 Assignment 2 (M6A2): Basic Compositional Shape Layouts**

Recommended Time Investment: 1-2 Hours **Recommended Frequency:** As Needed

In this assignment, you will need to create 3-5 basic compositional shape layout pages. They must comprise of the following:

1. A page with a rule of 3rds grid, and a selected focal point
2. A Primary shape
3. Secondary supporting shapes
4. A contrasting shape or shapes
5. (As needed) A diagonal element
6. (As needed) Depth considerations
7. (As needed) A Framing Element shape

3. **Module 6 Assignment 3 (M6A3): Final Course Assignment**

Recommended Time Investment: 1-3 Hours **Recommended Frequency:** Once -off

In this assignment, your task is to create **1-3 completed illustrations**, using everything you have learned in the course. Keep in mind the key theory and workflow implications of each module of the course, and ensure you gather and use good reference and inspirations images in building out your work. The final assignments can be final line-art, or full color, or shaded line-art.

Note: Ensure that when you have completed your assignments and are submitting them to the Character Art School Community, that you are clearly stating the course and assignment number, for example "M2A2", so that you are critiqued and given feedback correctly at your current level of knowledge.
